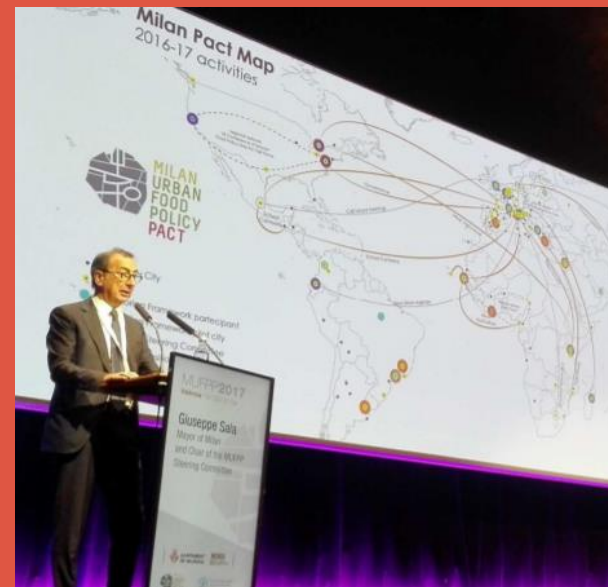

# IMPEGNO TRA SINDACI

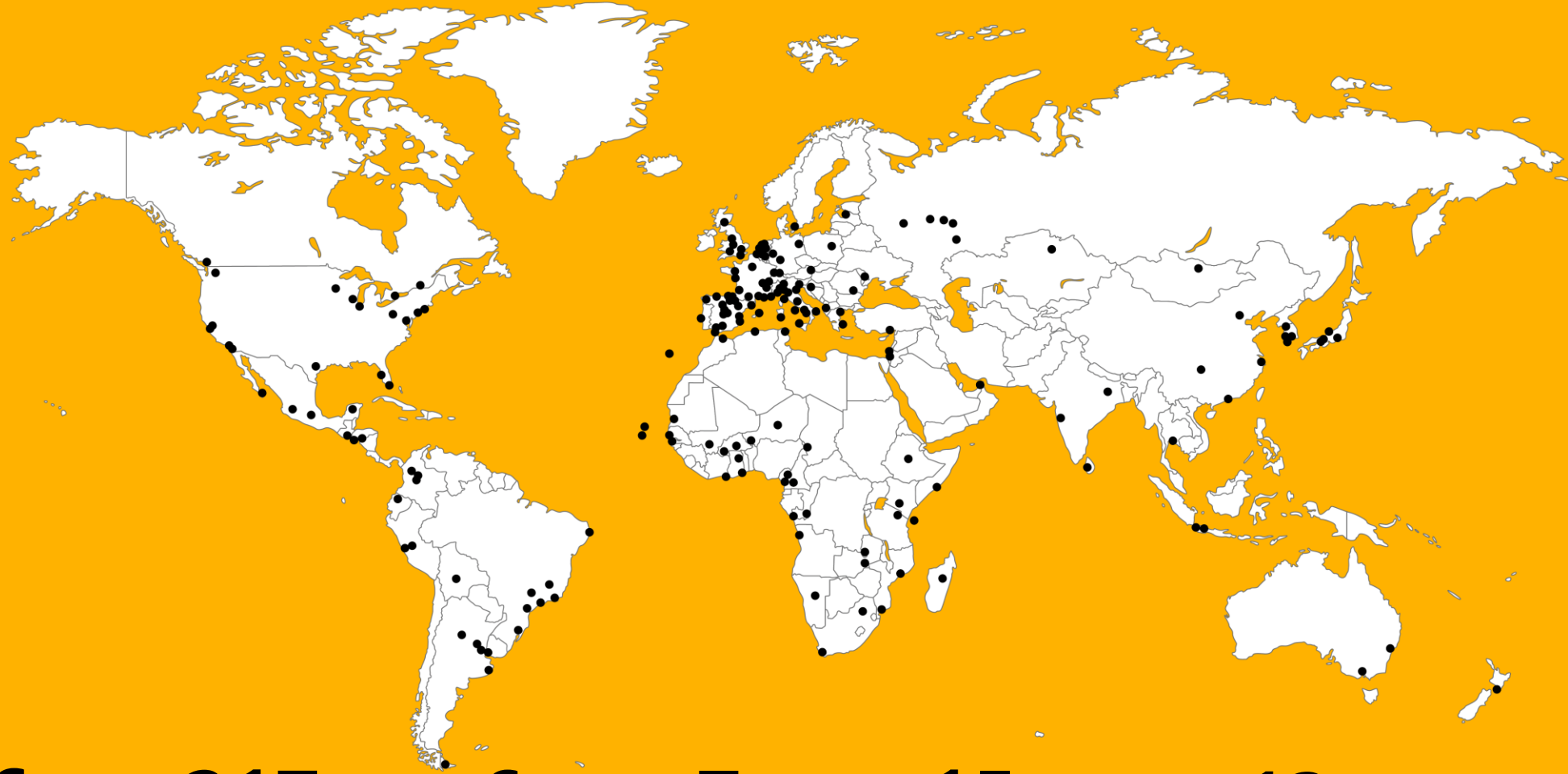

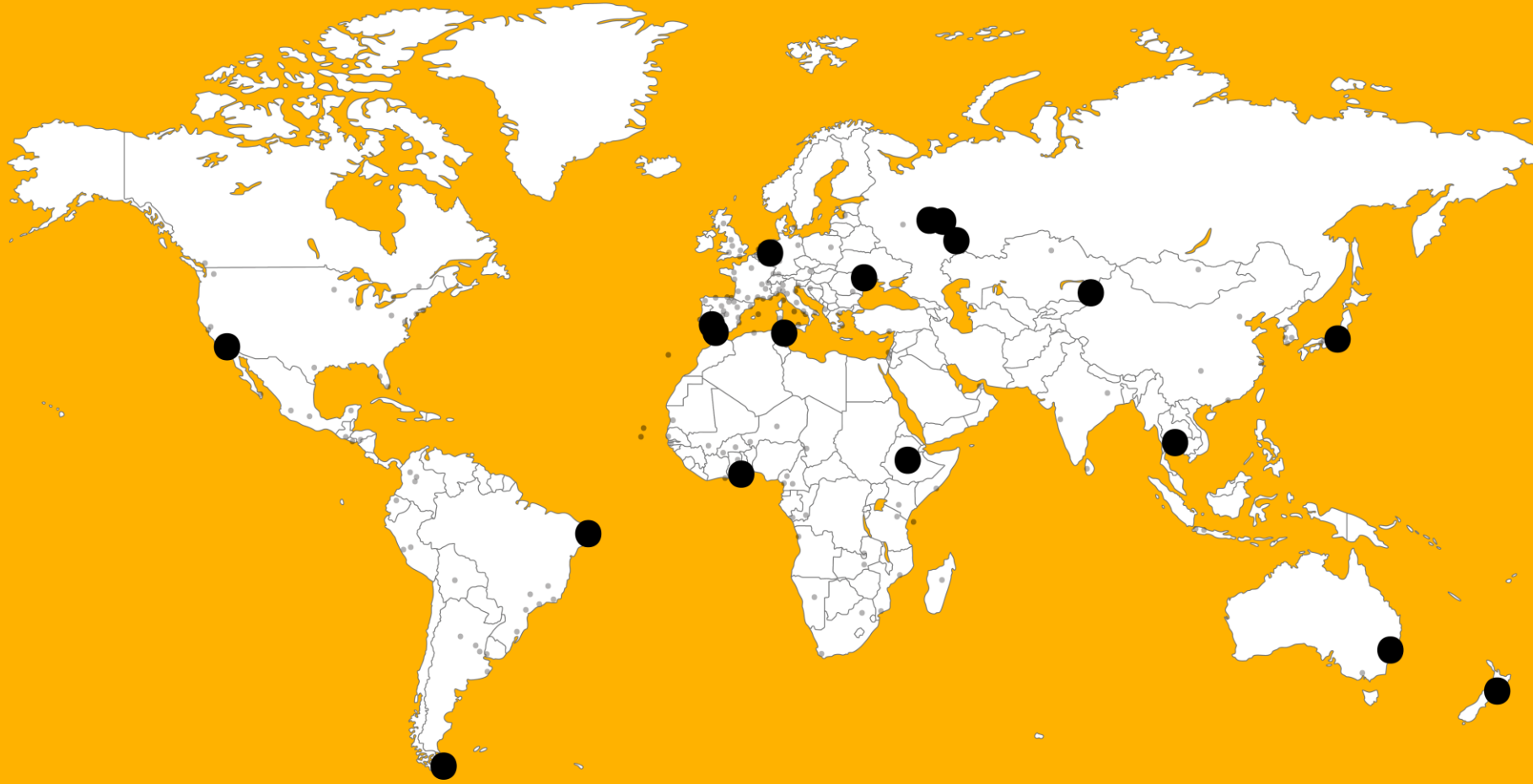
## Distribuzione popolazione per regione



## Distribuzione popolazione per città

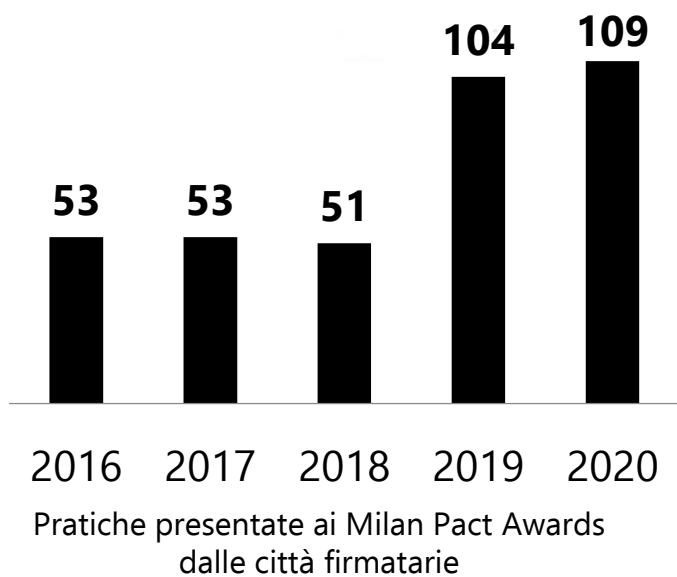
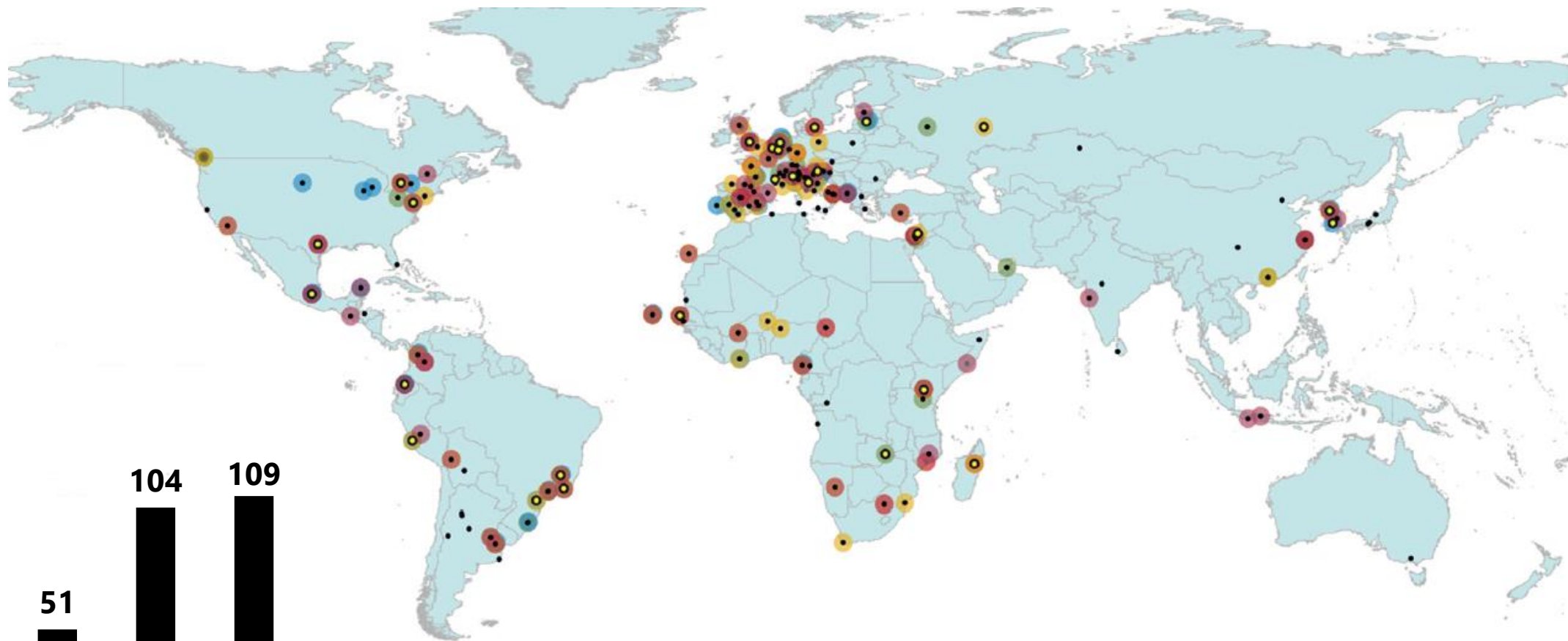

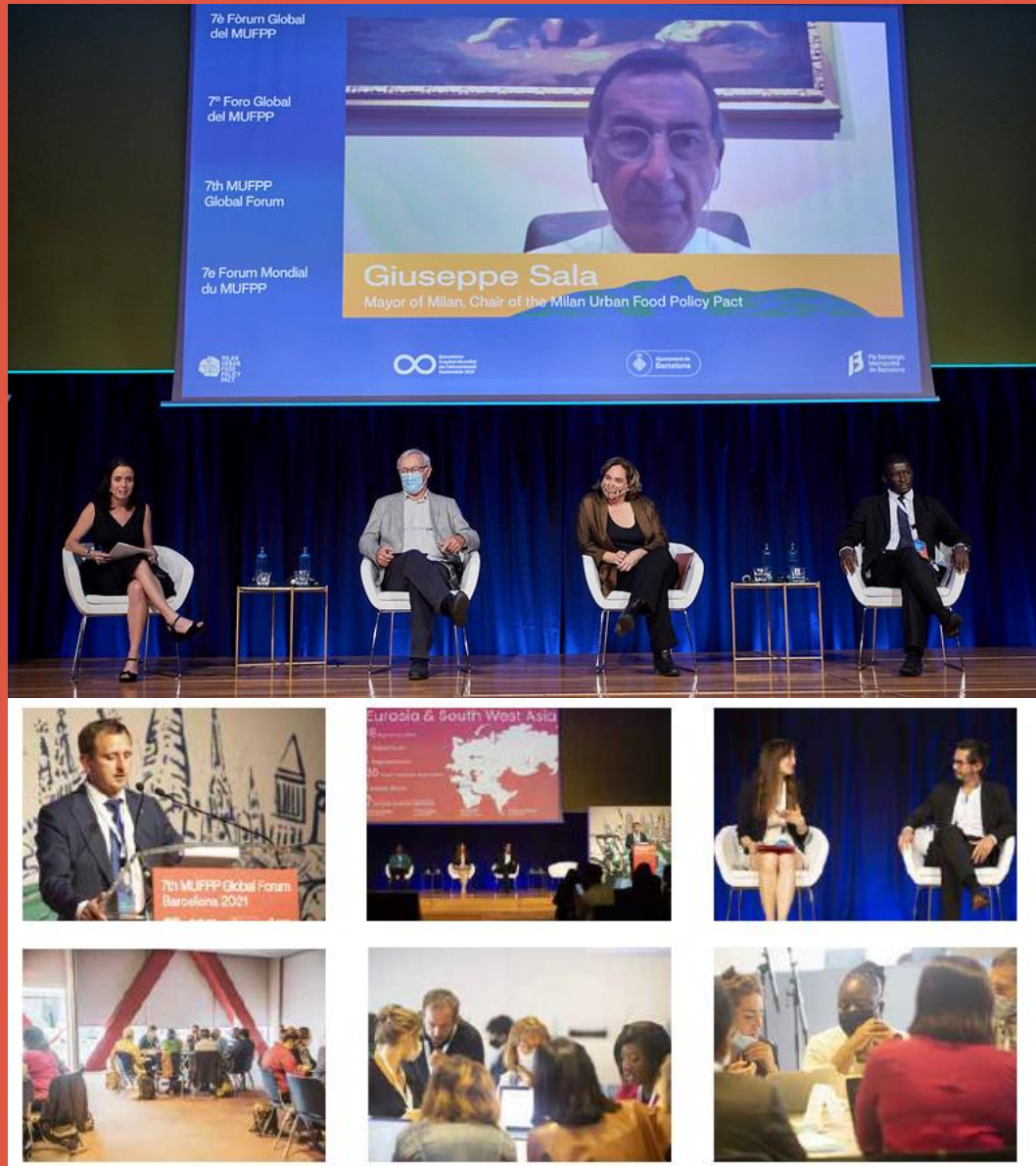

# 8 SESSIONI PARALLELE

## Cities on the Global Food Agenda

As food contributes to a third of global GHG emissions, this session focuses on the role cities are playing in the global food agenda when tackling the climate crisis.

Besides the valuable moderation of Júlia López Ventura (C40), the session featured amazing contributions from representatives of key organizations: Gunhild Stordalen (EAT Foundation) sharing some reflections on the outcomes of the UNFSS, Marcela Villarreal (FAO) expressing how the lessons learned at global level can be exploited also in international contexts, Carmen Burbano (WFP) explaining how cities can benefit from their respective countries signing the School Meals Coalition.

## Regional sessions

Cities face similar challenges and seek appropriate solutions for their specific geographical and socio-economic contexts. During the 6 parallel regionalization strategy sessions, the Steering Committee members of the designated region, presented to their cities their leadership plan to discuss about the goals, the challenges and the joint activities for the two years ahead. The commitment and the findings of each region were shared during the plenary of the State of the Pact and regionalisation strategies.

The results of the 6 leadership plans will structure the MUFPP Action Plan, combining the efforts of the Steering Committee in supporting an equal advancement in all the MUFPP regions.

## How to communicate urban food policies

Session co-organised by Barcelona University

Urban food policies aim to democratise food systems by empowering citizens and facilitating their participation in policy development and implementation. Key challenges arise to ensure equitable representation in policy spaces of diverse groups as well as communicating opportunities for citizens to engage in policy reform and specific actions. This session presents learnings from cities that have mobilised different communication strategies to coordinate action within and beyond city councils, as well as enhance citizen involvement and public support for transformative urban food policies.

## Integrated food policies for healthy citizens on a healthy planet

Session co-organised by EAT Foundation

This session highlights inspiring examples of urban policies focused on improving health, with special attention to obesity and inequalities. The session sees the participation of experts on an expert on the topic and representatives of three cities prioritizing urban food policies for health and obesity prevention.

## Food infrastructure to feed cities

Session co-organised by ICLEI

Food system infrastructure visibly promotes and sustains local food systems as well as connects buyers and sellers, consumers and producers. However, food system infrastructure not only includes physical and technology-orientated structure but also the actors and their social practices. This session highlights a wide range of inspiring examples of local governments using their food infrastructure to promote a local food system transformation.

## The Cities Pledge on Food Justice

Session co-organised by Birmingham City Council

This session reflects on lessons learnt around food security during the Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent legacy of disruption to the food system. The session also launches a new Cities Pledge on Food Justice to put political weight into the voices of cities emphasising the need for local and national and global policies which create and support an affordable, nutritious and sustainable food system for all citizens.

## The MUFPP Monitoring Framework and related approaches

Session co-organised by RUAF and FAO

The session encourages cities to use the new MUFPP Monitoring Framework Handbook and Resource Pack. This session draws on examples from the related City Region Food System assessment toolkit that specifically address climate resilience. As well as launching the new handbook and resource pack, this represents a call for cities to take the next step from signing the pact, to monitoring their progresses.

## Urban food policies to tackle the climate emergency

Session co-organised by C40

In order to tackle the climate emergency we must urgently transform the way we produce, eat, and dispose of food, worldwide. The session explains how cities are addressing the food-climate nexus at the city level through the delivery of the Good Food Cities Declaration. The session covers the three main themes of the Declaration: food procurement; healthy diets & the food environment; and food waste.

## Food environment

Session co-organised by GAIN

Food environments are related to the physical, economic, policy and socio-cultural surroundings, opportunities and conditions that influence people's decisions about acquiring, preparing and consuming food. The session showcases how cities are shaping their food environments to promote healthier and more sustainable food.

## Strengthening Territorial Food Systems

Session co-organised by UCLG

The session demonstrates the importance of articulating different levels of governance to address issues linked to hunger, malnutrition and sustainability and highlights examples on how cities and regions are promoting alliances with multi-stakeholders, adopting territorial policies to transform food systems and ensure the right to adequate and sustainable food and nutrition, particularly of the most vulnerable.

# 7 SIDE EVENTS

## The role of wholesale markets in transforming the food system

Session co-organised by **World Wholesale Market Association**

Wholesale markets are key actors in urban food systems. These markets constitute hubs where producers, traders, retailers and the food service sector come together, and therefore become essential infrastructures to support a diverse and vibrant urban foodscape. Wholesale markets are open spaces that contribute to improving efficiency in food distribution and enhance access to market information for various actors, as well as connect establish connections between urban and rural areas.

## Metrics Matter

Session co-organised by **Nourish Scotland and IPES-FOOD**

An increasing number of local governments around the world are adopting ambitious food policies to tackle health and nutrition, socio-economic inequalities, and the climate crisis. However, the impact of their efforts is often difficult to quantify and remains unknown. This event brings together city representatives and experts to discuss their experiences, successes, and challenges in developing and using appropriate metrics and indicators for measuring the climate, biodiversity, health, and resilience impacts of their food policies.

## Civil Society and Local Government alliances

Session co-organised by **Barcelona City Council**

Transforming the food system involves a multiplicity of actors: public and private sector, the scientific community and the civil society. In this side-event leading civil society groups, in alliance with local governments, present their transformative food projects in Barcelona and beyond.

## EU Food Policy Strikes again

Session co-organised by **Food Trails**

Food Trails is a EU-funded Horizon 2020 project aiming to translate in Europe the Milan Urban Food Policy Pact's collective commitment to integrated urban food policies into measurable and long-term progress towards sustainable food systems. The European Commission has funded 5 Horizon consortia to innovate local food systems, involving 52 cities, on which 21 are part of MUFPP and investing 48 million euro by 2024. The side event involves representatives of the 5 projects to share approaches to co-creation of effective food policy solutions with local actions, to conclude with a round table that questions how this European experience can inspire the entire MUFPP community.

## Integrated local food ecosystems to tackle climate change: URBACT's lessons

Session co-organised by **Urbact**

Since 2013, URBACT has supported 8 networks to learn from each other on the topics of sustainable food and urban agriculture. This represents almost 50 cities leading the transition towards more sustainable local food ecosystems. Building on the varied experiences of URBACT's smaller towns and larger cities, this session presents URBACT's work under the Food Knowledge Hub, discussing integrated local food systems through a variety of entry points, stakeholders and activities.

## Beginner's Guide to Food Policy

Session co-organised by **Food Foundation**

The UK Food Foundation's Food Cities 2022 initiative aims to mobilise and support city authorities in ODA countries to develop and implement food policies, strategies and multi-stakeholder partnerships that aim to increase access to healthy diets and generate a positive impact of urban food systems as they respond to the COVID-19 emergency. The initiative is a learning partnership that facilitates peer-to-peer exchange and offers an online platform with tools to guide cities in developing urban food systems solutions. The session describes the key stages to initiating a Food Policy/Strategy and participating cities explain their experience of beginning the process of developing a food strategy.

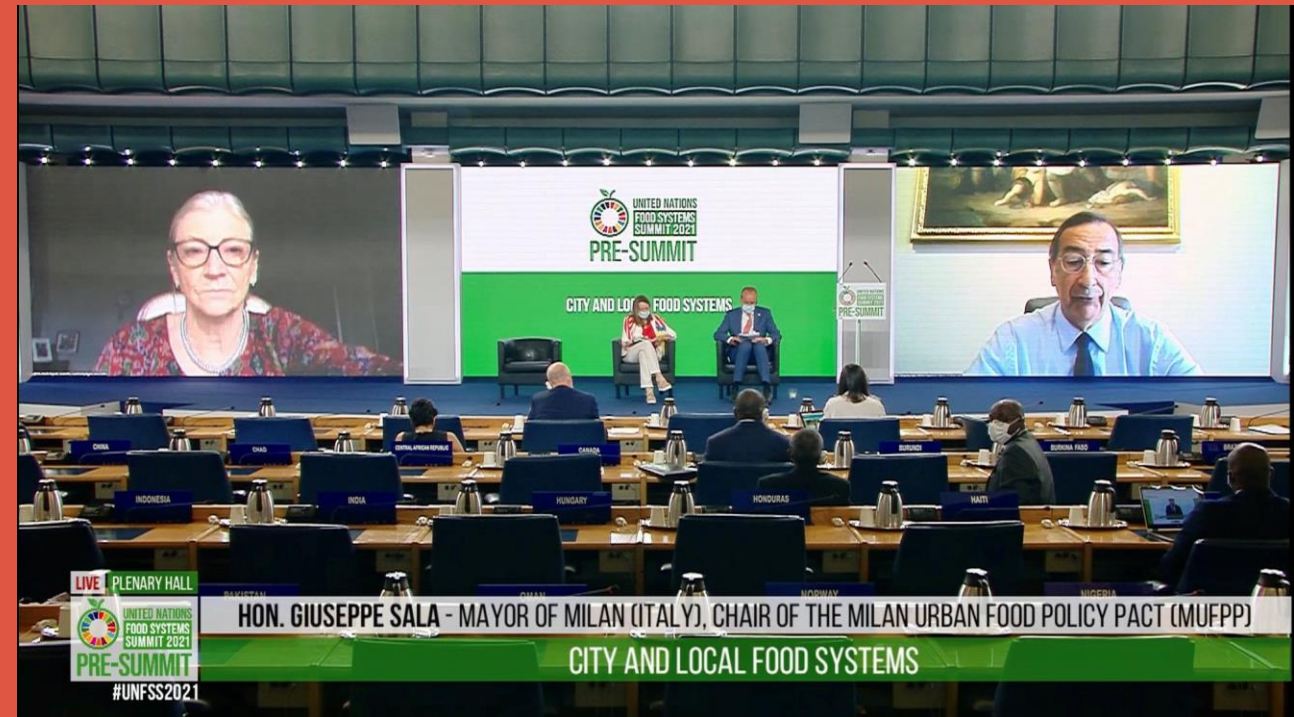
